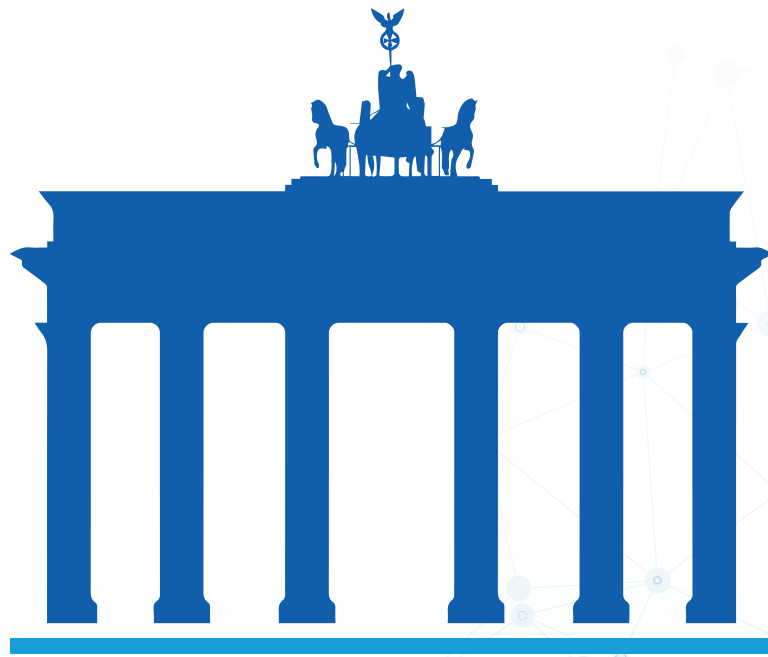

Your participation will be instrumental in the continued success of this network, offering you the unique opportunity to experience the collaborative spirit and impact dedicated to providing sustained cures and quality of life for all affected individuals.

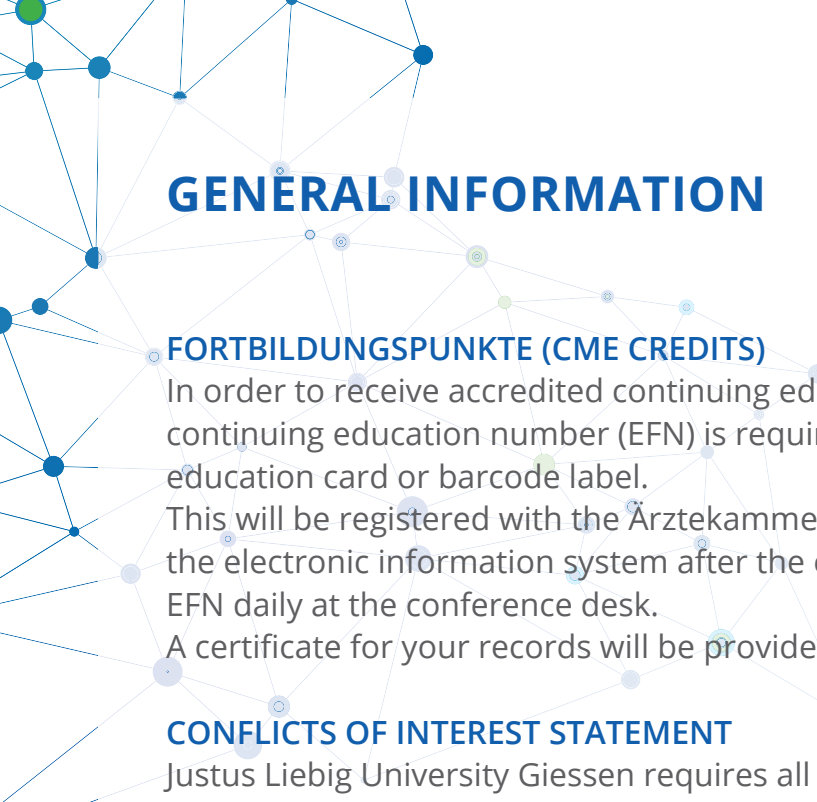
The presenting author of each poster is kindly requested to be present at their poster during the guided poster session.

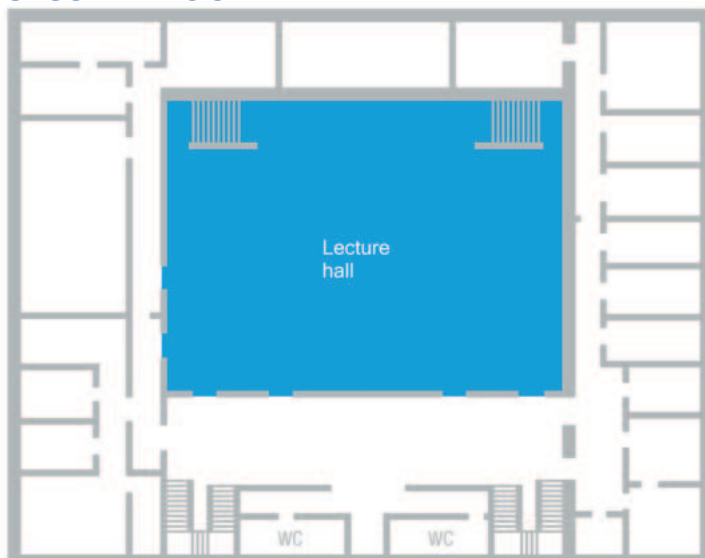
